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Frequently Asked Questions

1. What is a Bachelor of Science in Applied Health Science, Health Administration?

The Bachelor of Science in Applied Health Science program will prepare you to work in a multitude of nonclinical health careers. It is designed for those who seek to work in areas that improve the health of individuals and communities, including health care settings, physician offices, public health organizations, and government agencies. It may also serve as a stepping stone for students to pursue graduate and pre-professional programs in health administration.

2. Am I eligible for the Bachelor of Science in Applied Health Science program?

Students must meet the following requirements:

- Be admitted to UNA.
- Possess a 2.0 GPA on a 4.0 grade scale.

3. When can I start the Health Administration track?

Students can apply for admission to the program once general education courses are completed. There are two start dates in the ACONHP for the Health Administration track. Students can enroll in the program at any of the following times:

- Fall- 8 week term 1
- Spring- 8 week term 1

4. Will I be able to complete this program online?

The general education courses are available in the traditional face to face semester format with the majority of the general education courses also available online. All of the Bachelor of Science in Applied Health Science, Health Administration track is available fully online in the eight week format.

5. How long will it take for me to complete a degree?

The 60 general education credit hours can be completed in four semesters of full-time study. The 60 credit hours in the Applied Health Science program can be completed in four semesters of full-time study.

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
